Pest Management Project at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland

The Environmental Management Participation Program for the U.S. Army Environmental Command (USAEC) provides opportunities to participate in USAEC on-going applied research and development projects, and environmental technology demonstration projects at Army installations worldwide. Project areas include Environmental Compliance and Planning, Cultural Resources, Natural Resources, Range Management, and Geographical Information Systems.

An appointment is available at the Base Operations Support Division, Preservation Branch.

This appointment includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Support the Pest Management Program to complete pesticide compliance as well as technical aspects of pest management.
- Required to learn FIFRA, DoD, and Army regulations and how the regulations are applied to Army and DoD installations.
- Conduct projects with EPA and the states on pesticide safety, state certification requirements for pesticide applicators, state registration of pesticides.
- Update and maintain local pest management databases on plan status, program assistance visits, contract reviews, and out-of-cycle pesticide use requests.
- Review and prepare written responses to EL/RAMP notices dealing with pesticide regulation and pesticide applicator certification.
- Perform analysis of the Army's ability to meet DoD MoMs on pest management as assessed by the annual AEDB-EQ data submission.

Applicants should have received a bachelor's degree in Entomology or related discipline within three years of the desired starting date, or completion of all requirements for the degree should be expected on or about the starting date. Other applicants will be considered on a case-by-case basis. The program is open to all qualified U.S. citizens without regard to race, sex, religion, color, age, physical or mental disability, national origin, or status as a Vietnam era or disabled veteran.

The participants will be selected based on academic records, recommendations, applied research interests and compatibility of background with applied research programs and projects at Aberdeen Proving Ground and/or the host Installation.

The initial appointment is for **one year** and may be renewed for up to two additional years based upon recommendation of USAEC and subject to availability of funds. The appointment is **full time** at Aberdeen Proving Ground.

The participant will receive a monthly stipend. The stipend rate is determined based upon level of education, training, and experience. Inbound travel and moving expenses are reimbursed according to established policies. Travel and other costs will also be reimbursed for training related to the project and approved by ORISE and the host installation.

The participant must show proof of health and medical insurance. Health plans are available through the Oak Ridge Institute for Science and Education for Postgraduate Internship participants. The appointment is full time at the host installation.

Applications are accepted and processed on a continuing basis. The Environmental Management Participation Program for USAEC is administered by the Oak Ridge Institute for Science and Education.
